Laws and order: staying connected with legislators

We've heard the phrase "we're going to get through this together" quite a lot during the COVID-19 pandemic, but, as a cooperative, that sentiment is nothing new for Jackson Energy.

That cooperative spirit rings true as the Kentucky General Assembly gets down to business this month in Frankfort. After a few organizational days in January, the meat of the session begins on February 2. In coordination with fellow co-ops across Kentucky, Jackson Energy advocates for local interests and policies that support our community. And we need your help.

It is important for the elected leaders who represent you to know that you support Jackson Energy's efforts to ensure electric co-ops are treated fairly in Frankfort and have the flexibility and financial relief we need to deliver affordable, reliable electricity. One year ago, the voices of co-op members were heard loud and clear by lawmakers who agreed with our opposition to adding a sales tax to residential power bills.

On RuralPowerKY.com, you can sign up for free updates and join the grassroots coalition to speak up when lawmakers need to hear us.

In 2021, co-ops continue to defend your interests, including any attempts in Kentucky to add extra charges to electric bills to pay for expenses unrelated to the services provided by Jackson Energy.



In addition, Kentucky co-ops are working with the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association to communicate with our congressional delegation and the Biden administration on issues that affect our local communities and the services we provide.

In addition to the Senate and House district maps, this guide also includes a custom listing for each electric co-op territory, including Jackson Energy on page 9.




Committed to a co-op culture

Electric cooperatives, including Jackson Energy, have a unique and storied place in our country's history. Automated metering—what's in it for you?

Want instant information that can lower your electric bill? Getting timely, accurate data about your electric use is just one of the ways the advanced metering infrastructure (AMI) in use by Jackson Energy is making life better for our members.

This small piece of a larger, technologically advanced system provides efficiencies and information that significantly benefit Jackson Energy's members.

A few of the ways automated meters are good for you:

Accurate measurements

The meters, teamed with computer technology, measure electric use more precisely than older, analog meters. Data is collected hourly and daily so you can track your energy use in real time. Your automated meter enables Jackson Energy to offer prepaid service for your account.

Faster outage restoration

The communications capabilities of automated meters give



Jackson Energy the ability to pinpoint trouble along power lines, meaning line crews can make repairs more quickly.

Less dispatching of trucks

Issues that previously required a co-op employee to make a trip to a member's property, such as manual meter reading or service connections, can be done remotely. This reduces visits to your property, speeds service and lowers co-op expenses.

Improved power quality

Co-op employees can better monitor the grid to improve reliability,

efficiency and security. Identifying system inefficiencies can lower the co-op's operational costs.

You can look at your automated meter data via Jackson Energy's mobile app, SmartHub. In addition to monitoring your electricity use 24/7, you can pay bills, manage account services, report outages and view your billing and usage history all at your fingertips.
